



The Racial Equity Building Institute for the Americas (REBIA) is a program of the Puerto Rico Community Foundation (PRCF) that serves as a platform for initiatives and projects that promote grassroots anti-racist solutions for systemic change by impacting public policy and creating a new narrative of inclusion and racial equity for Afro-Latino communities.



## **ORIGINS**



The killing of George Floyd sparked a worldwide recognition of the need to address and tackle the deeply rooted racism in our society. This has led individuals, organizations, and governments to challenge the widespread injustices that disproportionately affect BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color) communities.



Considering the understanding of the systemic and institutional racism that permeates our society, REBIA was born from the need to create a platform of equity builders to join the anti-racist efforts being implemented throughout the Americas. Our program seeks to facilitate equitable access to resources and opportunities that allow us to eradicate the racism that threatens Afro-Latino communities.


• The REBIA logo uses a set of imperfect geometric figures that represent the 4 pillars that support the program and its mission.



• The color palette of the logo seeks to emulate tones of nature: **blue** of the sea, green of the forest, yellow of the sun, **red** of the earth.

## **IDENTITY**

- These imperfect geometric figures in the form of pebbles also represent the American continent's 4 regions: North, Central, Caribbean and South.



• In turn, the location and orientation of the pebbles simulate the African continent, thus connecting the Americas with our ancestral land.

## **IDENTITY**

- The geometric figures of the logo simulate adinkras, Ghanaian symbols originating from the Bono people that represent concepts or aphorisms.

**Knowledge for Action** Generate data to make Afro-descendant and Black communities visible.




**Narrative Change** Empower communicators to tell a new anti-racist narrative and heal.




